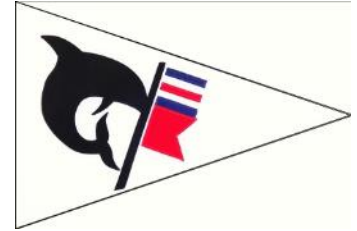

In addition to these completed classes, the six students in the on-going Navigation Class under the tutelage of P/C Lou Harlow, SN have completed their sight folders which were reviewed by P/Lt/C Richard Schoonmaker, SN. The students' final hurdle will be plotting a cruise using celestial navigation and GPS. Their courses over the years have included all of the navigation classes and for several, all of the electives,. Boating Report

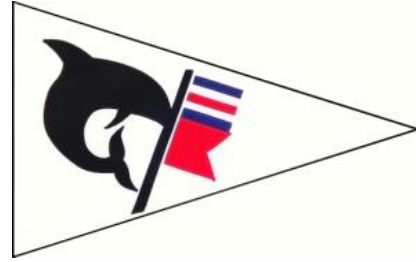
We had a Hurricane on morning of October 7, 2016, the worst of it at my home sitting 25 feet from Banana River was 1 to 4 AM. I watched TV during that time and found wind noise the loudest outside. The TV said it was 106 MPH at KSC. Believe thats back in off the water. One of the loud bangs I heard outside was one corner of the Boat Lift Cradle Cable letting loose. The nose of my 24 foot Chaparral Boat went down into the water. The boat slid forward off the Cradle, then into the water further and the Aluminum Cradle beat the boat the rest of the night. All of this unknown to me as I had Shutters blocking the windows so could not see outside without opening a door and I am not going to do that.

At 6:30 AM, my dogie wants to take a walk. My neighbors have all evacuated Merritt Island so we are alone, with electric, TV and the storm now hitting Daytona. We still have 35 MPH winds going outside but we take a walk along our Sea Wall and the neighbors. Dogie is excited and I am really looking things over, but not out. Lots of limbs down but no house damage, then I look to docks. The nose of my Chaparral is all that is out of the water and the waves are really banging it. Dogie and I run out on the dock and I am in shock.

I ran back to the house and told Margie to look at the boat. Wow! I say, "I am going to get to work raising it to get the salt water out of the Chevrolet/Volvo Engine." Margie thinking well says, "No, call your insurance first." I figure there is not a chance. I ring up my insurer of many years, GEICO/Seaworthy. They answered, they routed me to Catastrophic Claims. A lady answers and gives me a Claims Number and says you do nothing. We will get the boat up and determine its condition. What about Salt Water in engine? She says, do not worry, we will raise it today and pickle it. In thinking with thousand of claims, what is the chance!!!

Well, They have Towboat US there the next day, Saturday, by truck with pumps and air bags. I offer some advise, but am allowed to watch mostly. Occasionally they ask me for things. At 4 hours, they finally go under it and plug holes which then allows the 2 Trash Pumps running full tilt to start bringing it up. Aw, Good!!! Then a Red Towboat US Boat drives to my dock. Two Channel 9 ABC guys jump off onto the dock without permission and immediately start filming the boat, its condition and all of us. Wow. They watch and film for an hour when finally the boat is deemed ready to tow. Towboat US guys ask for my trailer which I provide. The Announcer Channel 9 ABC guy asks if I am the owner? Can they film me? They have for the last hour. Will I allow an interview. They asked me many questions, which I answered. Then that quickly, they got back on the boat and off went my boat under tow. A clipped interview is on the 11 PM news that night. The CDR copied it and put on our web. The other fellows left with my trailer, asking me if they could put the Boat Rig in my yard for awhile.

Many conversations with GEICO CAT TEAM, but my boat was totaled. My policy was "Agreed Value" less 10% Named Storm amount. Never had I dealt with an insurance claim even though I had owned over 25 boats since I turned 15 years old. But my company could not have been better and its over. I understand my former boat is at Big Jims in Melbourne and is owned by a Massachusetts Salvage company. What an experience this was. I was un-trusting but the checks came thru. This is my report and I am sticking to it. Whew...
