Though the numbers were small we had a really smooth running class with lots of interest from the students.

Our instructors included our commander, John Mulkey, P, Steve Winter, P, Roger Cowles, Tom Jensen, Joe Derrico and Lt/C's Rick and Sandy Schoonmaker, SN. Also helping out at registration and on exam night were P/C Sue Kneeland, SN, Lt Marion Sweigert, AP, Marilyn Schmidt and, of course, Lt Doris Valentine, who signed up quite a few new members. The real yeomen of the course were the members who signed up to be proctors. They included P/C Duane Balkema, AP, Howard Bernbaum, SN, Lt Bob Flanigan, SN, P/C Sam Greenwood, SN, and Jim Wonnell, P.

In regard to our member courses, we are now accepting registration for two of them: Seamanship and Weather. Weather will be taught on Wednesdays in the Cocoa Library and Seamanship on Thursdays at Wuesthoff Hospital. They will both start soon after Thanksgiving and members will be notified by phone of the exact starting date.

Seamanship is one of the initial courses for new members. It covers boat handling, marlinspike, rules of the road and a bit of nautical etiquette. It's a prerequisite for the other Advanced Grades and is especially aimed at new enrollees from the Boating Course. It will include an orientation to the Squadron. The class chairman for Seamanship will be P/C Sam Greenwood, SN, who has lots of practical experience on the water. But Seamanship is not just for new members. We're especially anxious to get those veteran members to take the course who don't yet have an "S" or better after their name. It's fun. You'll enjoy it.

Weather is a very interesting and fairly intense course of study. You'll be able to do some forecasting and have a better understanding of the weather patterns that affect us here in Florida. 


