'Tis the Holiday Season and everyone is already over-booked with activities. I hope that you have found a place on your calendar for the Christmas Holiday Party on 10 December. This year we are taking a different approach with a more casual get-together but have kept the music for those of you who like to get a little dancing exercise to burn off some of those wonderful calories consumed at the hors d'oeuvres buffet. For those of you who were not able to attend our November membership meeting I would like to share some up-dates.

First of all, the squadron has elected to go with USPS National's Annual Membership Billing schedule. For current members, the only change will be the manner in which dues will be paid. The bill will arrive as usual from National in early May. The payment will be sent directly back to National either by check or credit card. National will send out the reminder notices (saving our postage costs). National will also send your renewed membership card (saving some more postage).

New member will pay an entire year's dues upon joining and their renewal date will occur 12 months from their joining date. National will keep track of this and mail out notices and renewals.

The money collected by National will be directly deposited in CBPS's bank account on a monthly basis and our treasurer will be notified.

The other change that the membership agreed to is related to the change of membership billing categories to match those adopted by National and District this past year. We will now have one category for a single member and one category for any additional people sharing the same household with the single member. The single member pays 100% of the dues and the second household category will pay 50% of the dues. Please note that the number of household members is unlimited but each must meet membership requirements.

If you have questions regarding these changes, please feel free to give me a call.

One last detail....the January meeting will be held on the Second Tuesday, 9 January, at the Civic Center at 1900. Please note this change.




