-<u>Idle Speed (NO WARE)</u> Lowest speed needed to maintain steering and make headway. -<u>Slow Speed (NO EXCESSIVE SPEED)</u> Fully off plane and completely settled in the water, <u>without plowing.</u>

# **VESSEL SAFETY CHECK**



December Boating Report, P/C Duane L. Balkema, AP

Scheduled, we have a Raft-Up for "Viewing the Cocoa Beach Christmas Boat Parade" on the evening of December 11, 2010. At 6:00 PM the Parade boats assemble just south of the HWY 520 Bridge on Banana River. Fly your USPS Flag to identify each other, and then we will proceed east on the channel toward Sunset Café only turn out, South, toward the center of that wide lagoon and raft up and watch each boat go by, viewing it when to north, to east and to south.


Scheduled, *December 20, 2010, a Monday* evening, DEPARTING KI-WANIS ISLAND, is a "*Cruise on Sykes Creek to View Christmas Lights*" *on the Dolphin*. This is an easy way to enjoy a ride in comfort. Drinks are provided and bring a snack if desired. The boat is covered and there is a toilet. The *fee is \$22 and you must call Mark at 652-1052 and book for the event*. Boat Report 3--My Sea Ray 31 Foot Sedan Bridge Economy Project Cost reduction is my project with a SRV 310 of 1982 Sea Ray Flybridge vintage. Before we leave the engines subject, a technical difficulty to cover is making the prop wash look right and perform. General Motors supplies nearly all of the gas Marine Engines in boats to Crusader, Mercruiser, and Volvo, building the engines so they can run right rotational direction as in a car or counter-rotate as needed for the opposing engine in a boat. Cleverly they do this with only a camshaft change. But they grind the camshaft drive gears for the distributer (sparker of some kind) like the original rotation engine allowing the use of interchangeable distributers. (some crankshaft trigger without a distributer) Doing this you must change the firing order of the spark plugs, an easy job. Why do I mention this? Well the big 454 cu inch Mercruiser engines I pulled out were counter-rotating, but the 4-Cylinder 3.0 engines I put in were never built reversible. Therefore I could not use both original transmissions that were in the Sea Ray with the new engines. Now I must do the reverse rotation of one engine with one of the transmissions if I want the wake of the props to look right. So I purchased a used reverse rotation Model AS15-71CR Velvet Drive Transmission, which looks and installs just like the original. (More to come on the project)




