Your Educational Department continues to be busy. Among our member courses, the Advanced Piloting final exam was held on 8 December and Seamanship is now underway on Wednesdays taught by P/C Sam Greenwood, SN, in the Cocoa Library. We plan for a Piloting course to follow Seamanship. The Weather Course is scheduled to begin on Thursday, 5 January, at the classroom in Wuesthoff Hospital. Lt/C Rick Schoonmaker, SN, will be the Weather instructor.

Regarding our boating courses, Lt Pete Schmidt, P, reports that the final tabulation for the fall Boat Smart course shows 21 registered and all 21 passing the exam. That's a great result. It means we didn't loose one student, a tribute to the good job done by Pete and his crew of instructors and proctors. In 2006 we plan to present the four-week course twice, starting 15 March and 6 September, at Cape Canaveral Hospital. In addition, we plan a one-day course, to be held in conjunction with Safe Boating Week, on 20 May. Location and arrangements for this course are not yet finalized.

They also work with virtually every navigation software program on the market. All you need to do is visit the Educational Page on the USPS Member Site and select the Free Chart download button.

As an additional bonus, both Maptech and McGraw-Hill, have posted on-line discount stores accessible only to USPS members. Maptech gives you a 20% discount at checkout for any of their products. Use a credit card and it will be shipped directly to your address. McGraw-Hill provides a 35% discount price listed for a wide selection of marine titles. Use your credit card for direct shipment. These are discounts not available to the public. This is a great place to look for gifts - for others or yourself. On top of these great discounts, every order benefits USPS directly. 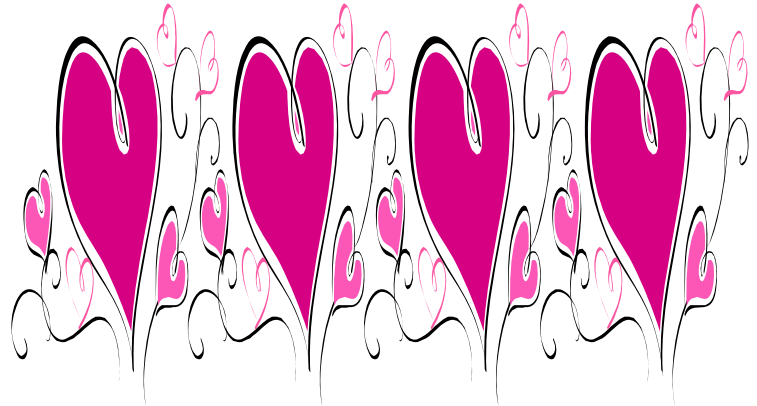

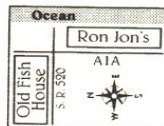

2005 Cocoa Beach Power Squadron Boating Activities Wrap-Up

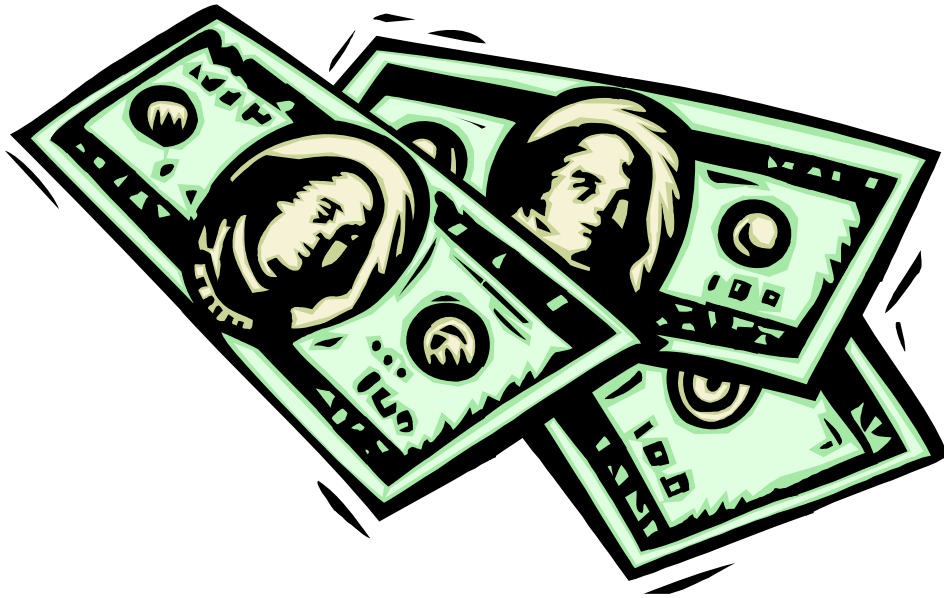

Well, 2005 was another heavy weather year, which is not the best for boating activities. Yes, we did have to scrub a few of planned boating events. However, New Orleans clearly suffered the worst of it. Think of the waterways charting possibilities in those waters! This is a capsule of what I know of and how it went.

Capt. John Lynn on his 35' Sloop, TUIT, holds top honors for cruises by a squadron member in 2005, having sailed five weeks and 692 knot miles GPS to and around the Abacos. His presentation about the trip to the membership gave us all a feeling of the excitement. Capt. Richard Fille started the year owning 2 large Carver Yachts, although now he has one 48' named Copia at Whitley Bay Marina. His big trip was from here, across the Okeechobee Waterway to the west coast of Florida, down to Marco Island, then up to Sarasota, and back home over 7 weeks. Capt. Michael Stone on Makin Memories, their 36 Sea Ray and Capt. Duane McConkey on Conch Key II, their 39 foot Carver made a memorable 3 1/2 week, 525 mile trip up to Jacksonville and then South down the St. Johns River. And there were other trips, some with the "Skippers", and of course the Mates were on board helping with all of the activities.

Locally, our May "Blessing of the fleet" was a lot of fun. I was able to get the Coast Guard to come over and join the parade with us. They seemed very happy to participate in our event. Its reassuring to see those husky young men who protect us, and note, they all wore PFD's all of the time. I believe my 34 Wellcraft, Prime Time, was the only boat to go past the blessing boat twice. No, I was not hogging the show, rather, as I lead the Parade past the blessing boat, I then quickly went back, tied to and towed Capt. Frank Sebree on his 'new to him', Hurricane deck boat past the blessing boat. He was having a minor problem with his engine. Thanks goes to Pastor Carroll Travis from Saint David's by the Sea Episcopal Church of Cocoa Beach who performed this old custom of "Blessing of the fleet". Our Melbourne Harbor Cruise and Overnight saw around 10 boats participate plus some visitors came by auto. The Titusville cruise and July 4th Raft-Up were equally a lot of fun. Our committee tried to hook up with Titusville and Banana River Power Squadrons on several events, but the Titusville Cruise was the only actual linkup.

We truly thank all of our members who took the time, energy and expense to get out there on the water and participate. Thanks be also, to the Boating Committee. As you would imagine, some squadron members bought boats, some sold boats. Al Papas has an interesting new Florida built Sloop. I am still totally reoutfitting an older Sea Ray Sedan Bridge 31. The Milners 39' Sea Ray was trapped by the weather. Yes, it did, the hurricanes took out their dock and power source and left the Sea Ray out there unconnected out of the water but on the lift in the Indian River West of their home. I notice that some of our new members have some fine boats and we want to get them more involved in squadron activities. There were quite a few boats that need to be used more to keep them in good shape. Well there is always next year! If I missed anyone's cruise of note, please contact me and we'll record it. I hope to cruise to the Keys soon, is anyone else interested in such a trip?
