

# VESSEL SAFETY CHECK



#### COOPERATIVE CHARTING IN A NUTSHELL Part One of Three Lt/C Ernst Hofmann, JN

Members of our squadron are offered three programs that give us the opportunity to provide a service to outsiders: Basic Boating education courses, Vessel Exams and Coop Charting. The latter has to do with furnishing the National Ocean Service (NOS) with information that helps keep their charts up-to-date.

Nautical charts, which are a true marvel of information, got their start in 1807 when the Congress appropriated \$50,000 for President Thomas Jefferson to have the nation's coastline surveyed and charted. This original project was to take no longer than one year.

Those 'Marching Orders' were the basis of the organization that was to be later known as the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey (USC&GS) and today, the National Ocean Service. Back in 1960, the USC&GS initiated a program to provide a series of specially designed nautical charts for the recreational boater. The idea soon evolved to enlisting the services of the members of USPS to assist in the maintenance and updating of these charts culminating with the Memorandum of Agreement signed January 1963 by the NOS and USPS.

Since April 1, 2003, all USPS districts have been submitting their Cooperative Charting reports via the CCWeb. After USPS members collect the data in the field, they will input it onto a collection of forms using any web browser. Once this data has been validated, the data from the forms is stored in a database on a server located at NOAA headquarters Maryland. This information will be quality reviewed by the Nautical Data Branch to determine if it should be forwarded to the cartographers to update the nautical charts and/or *US Coast Pilots*. On average, USPS submits 7237 Nautical items per year to NOS.

Coop Charting consists of six programs: Range Line Surveys, Nautical Chart Update Surveys, Coast Pilot Updates, Small-Craft Facility Reports, Depth Surveys and the Inspection Surveys.

## Who Am I?

I was born in Brooklyn, NY during the depression in 1928. When I was an infant, my Father died, and my Mother sent me to live with my Grand-Parents in Austria. My Grand-Parents returned me to the USA, when Hitler came to power in 1933. I attended grade schools in Brooklyn NY, and high school in Long Island NY.

In 1945, I enlisted in the navy during World War II., but I did return back to NY to finish high-school. I re-enlisted in the navy in 1947 as I realized "being a sailor" was lots of fun, at least most of the time! Upon re-enlisting, I attended electronics school, and while there met a group of submarine sailors. Their stories, and demeanor, plus the comparatively informality, convinced me, that this was the way to go! I qualified as a submarine sailor in 1949, and was promoted to Chief Petty Officer in 1954.

I was married in 1955, and moved my family to various states in the USA and overseas as well, as duty called. In 1957, I was commissioned as an Ensign in Idaho.

In 1968, I was transferred to the Naval Ordinance Test Unit at Cape Canaveral, and I moved my wife and three children to Patrick Air Force Base.

I joined Cocoa Beach Power Squadron in 1972, then was elected as Commander in 1972. I achieved the grade of Navigator, and I have taught most of the courses the USPS offers. I certainly enjoy being an active participant of the Cocoa Beach Sail and Power Squadron.




