As you all realize May is Safe Boating Month, so let us look at how safe boaters, mariners, fishermen, and tourists have fared in the last few months.

The latest accident we have read about was that of a Staten Island Ferry at a speed of 6 knots slammed into the ferry slip. This caused over one million dollars of damage, injuring many people. Six knots to the layman is not a lot of speed, but in some circumstances it can be very costly. Then two ships collided in Pembrook Dock in Wales, and one was very badly damaged. Two ships collided in the Swedish Port of Oxelosund--one was docked. Ships run aground, 1. A container ship MSC Tina in the Netherlands due to engine failure. 2. The same ship ran aground again in Belgium after an electric failure.

A Canadian training barquentine was hit by a micro-burst and sank 300 miles off of Brazil. 19 hours later all hands were rescued by the Brazilian Navy.

These are only a few of the many accidents which occur on the high seas, in ports of call and bays and lakes. Be careful and think before you act.

Squadron Members, summer is upon us as is Hurricane Season. I do hope you are prepared. Myself, I try to have it worked out that in the event of a threat my personal safety, the property and the boat are as prepared as possible. Remember that boat out back needs to be considered with a plan to minimize damage although it is falls third in priority.

June 12th, Saturday, is Cruise to Marker 21 and overnight if it meets your schedule. Inter-coastal Channel Marker 21, South of Melbourne, is near some Sand Islands that have been used as a raft up point for area boaters for years. As a bit of trivia, my first longer boat trip after joining CBPS (before CBSPS) was to operate my Pacemaker 28 from home to Marker 21 Islands and join Banana River Power Squadron Friends for a Corn Roast there-I believe I remember George Hunt was commander. CBPS member Chuck Conklin made that trip as well.

If severely electronically inclined, us the Charts to pick up the electronic location or just the Marker 21. It is a good run for me, but I plan to make it if the weather cooperates. Some members find it a much shorter distance. Arrange it so you overnight Friday night or plan to arrive around noon and we get together by 1:00 for lunch. BRSPS has this on their event calendar.


