- Advances in medicine, longer lifespan, an exponential population increase in Florid and increased deferrals due to strict FDA guidelines have severely lowered our community blood supply.

Your donation is usually transfused to a patient within 72 hours.





MARINE INDUSTRIES ASSOCIATION OF FLORIDA JOHN LYNN– LEGISLATIVE CHAIRMAN

Preliminary Biological Status Reviews Complete

Tallahassee– Three biological review panels, each consisting of five experts appointed by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), recently completed preliminary biological status reviews of three Florida's imperiled species. These reviews were conducted in response to petitions to re-evaluate the status of the bald eagle, gopher tortoise, Florida manatee and Panama City crayfish. The current recommendations include:

-<u>Bald Eagle</u>– Remove from the imperiled species list. Since 1980, bald eagle populations have rebounded dramatically. Research indicates the species does not meet any of the listing criteria. Today, we have more than 1,100 active eagle nests.

-<u>Gopher Tortoise</u>– Reclassify the species from species of special concern to threatened. Continued population and habitat decline contributed to the recommendation in this assessment.

-<u>Florida Manatee</u>-classify the species from endangered to threatened. The manatee population has increased over the past few decades, but threats still remain that could cause the population to decline significantly in the future.

Experts will present final peer-reviewed classification recommendations to the Commission in June in West Palm Beach. The management plan will include public input.




