<u>For your information</u>: US Coast Guard Marine Safety Bulletin 04-07 (01/10/07), has been issued. It is part of their educational outreach initiative to identify the proper use of Marine Sanitation Devices and ensure compliance with federal, state and local laws regarding the discharge of sewage from recreational and commercial vessels within federal and state waters. It addresses the various types of proper devices, cites the Florida law requiring all vessels 26 feet or longer, with an enclosed cabin and berthing facilities, to have a working toilet on board. It defines a "No Discharge Zone", as a body of water where the discharge of treated and untreated sewage is prohibited. Local restrictions may also apply, as is the case in the Port of Canaveral where no sewage discharge, treated or untreated, is permitted. It further provides the guidelines for use of "Y - valves". A copy of the subject bulletin may be obtained from either Lt Bob Flanigan, SN (Safety Chairman), or me.



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
