# "NAVIGATION WITH GPS & RADAR ON YOUR COMPUTER"

Lt. Jim O'Malley, AP will show you how radar is superimposed on his GPS chart with his lap top computer, combining everything in one image, thereby eliminating a helter skelter situation. The image on his screen shows: 1) exactly where you are on the chart; 2) your speed and direction, 3) buoys and navigation hazards, and 4) superimposed radar showing the location and recent direction, on the chart, of other boats. # EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT P/Lt/C Mike Stone, P

The Fall season is upon us. Now is the time to prepare your boat for the long Fall and Winter seasons when you might not be using your boat as much as you did during the Summer months. A good overall cleaning and a wax job if necessary is a good place to start.

This is also a good time to change the oil (disposing of the used oil properly) and add stabilizer to the gas tank to preclude fuel problems in the spring.

Vessel examinations are winding down for the year but there is much to be done to increase the squadron numbers for inspections. Vessel examiners have done a great job so far this year, but there is still time to do more.

Co-op charting is a bit behind for the year and needs some additional support by squadron members. While you are out on the water, keep a lookout for missing or damaged markers, sunken vessels, and check bridges for damage to the fenders, missing or inoperative lights and depth markers that are either unreadable or missing. All these things are important safety considerations as well as reportable items for co-op charting.

The Boat Smart course held its final exam last Wednesday with 12 students taking the test. The number is small but this represents everyone who signed up for the course. That's a 100% retention rate! Something we haven't had for a long time. Thanks to P/C John Mulkey, P, and Lt Pete Schmidt, P, who did a fine job running the course. And thanks to all of those who helped out as proctors, instructors and administrators. And thanks to Lt Doris Valentine who recruited quite a few new members out of this small, but high quality class.

The Marine Electronics course has began at Wuesthoff Hospital with Lt Howard Bernbaum, SN, as instructor assisted by Gary Monai, P. We have eight students registered for the course and it promises to be a good one. Wuesthoff has been quite accommodating at the lobby desk and cafeteria and we have made a donation to the Wuesthoff Foundation to show our appreciation. A similar donation has also been made to Cape Canaveral Hospital, where the Boat Smart course was taught.

It's been shortened but also includes the fundamentals of ocean cruise planning, the Pilot Chart and ocean navigation with both and celestial. And it really is fun! 

Those of us, who were, enjoyed a number of interests including the enlightening meetings and energy of the various national committees. Meetings aside, we also had a rare treat of cruising the New York Harbor aboard the World Yacht's *Princess*. Encouragement and detail on the new reporting process was given at the last two conferences. As a group, we need to get out and plan activities around getting our co-op charting done. Some individuals have already done a fine job, however, and have represented their squadrons well. We all can do more.

In addition to the Co-op charting presentation at the Fall Conference, we had Presentations on Web Site Development, Instructor Recertification, Power Point Use/Map Tech Digital Charts and PRO. In case you were under a rock, you also know that this conference also celebrated Banana River Sail and Power Squadron's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. A great job was done by the Banana River Sail and Power Squadron Committee on the conference and the party. We all had a great time. Congratulations, Banana River Squadron!

At the end of September, we were 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation of the 33 districts in USPS in VSC Inspections. In addition to our boating classes, the VSC program is our next best opportunity to teach and meet the public. We have done 944 inspections and every boat has two or more passengers. So, we are reaching a lot of boaters.

The district has just up-dated our PRO program for 2006. Look for it. We need to get more members involved in this vital program which is the artery that feeds students into the safe boating classes. No squadron should be without a PRO. Enthusiasm is the main qualification. Our USPS manual the "PRO LOG" is your guide.

Looking ahead, our next council meeting will be January 20<sup>th</sup> 2007, at the Silver Lake Community Church in Leesburg. The USPS Annual Meeting is again in our area in 2007. This time, it will be held at the Hyatt Riverfront in Jacksonville on 20-25 February 2007. We have been fortunate to have had the Annual Meeting in Orlando for many years making it easy for us to attend. I, for one, have been to every one since I joined the USPS. We then have the D23 Spring Conference 23-25 March, hosted by all squadrons. Also, plan to attend the D 23 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on 5-7 October 2007. #### **INDIVIDUALS WIN D 23 AWARDS**






