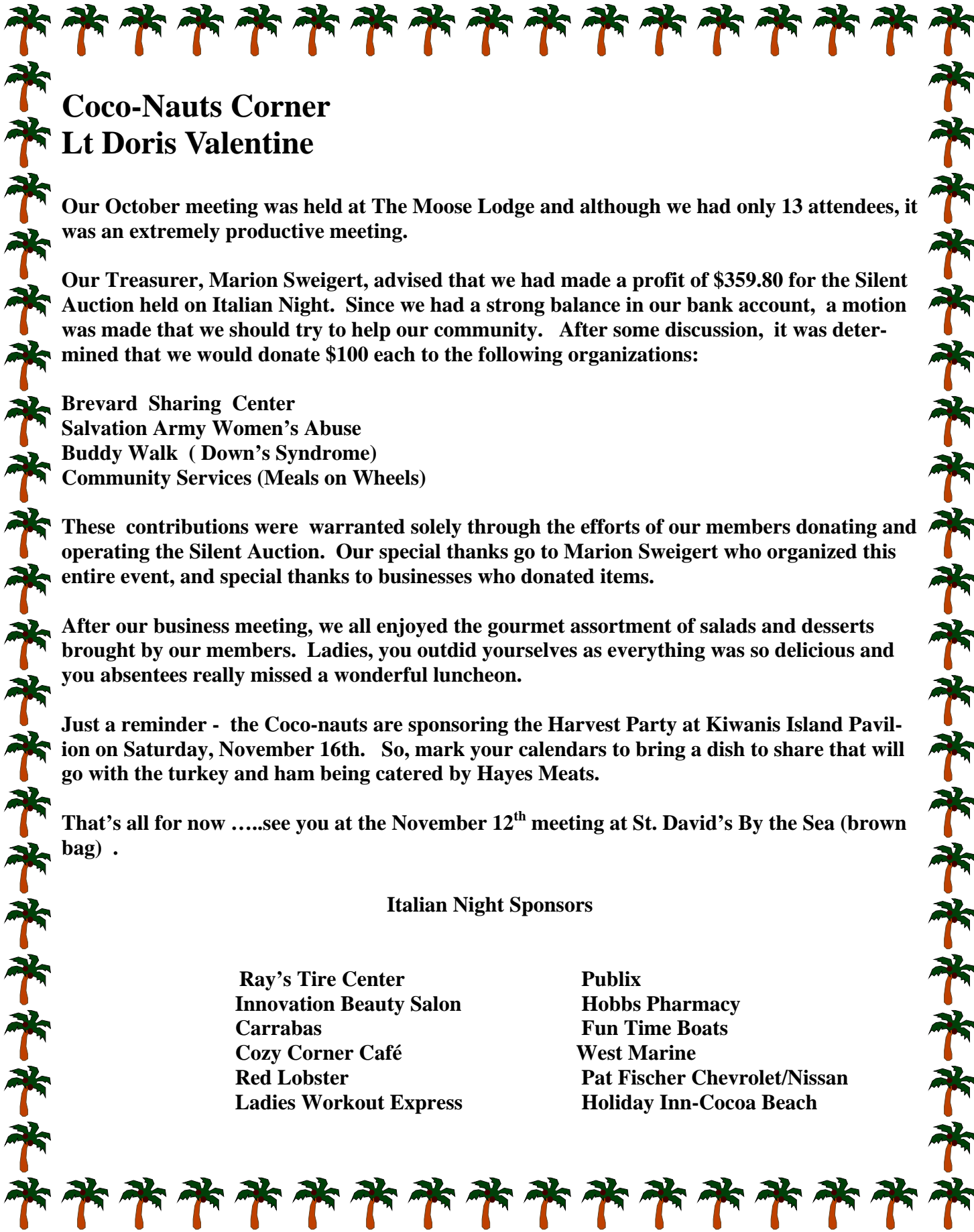

A D 23 Bridge meeting, departmental meetings and the D23 Council and Conference always prove to be very informative. Where were you this year? Do you as an individual member of your squadron realize you are also a member of D 23 as well as the National USPS? District plans two meetings a year which are hosted by the various squadrons in the district. One day, two days or three depends on you. Participate in the meetings on Saturday only or join the festivities for Friday and Saturday night dinners. Sunday breakfast with the "N" club might just encourage you to go forward and get your Navigation grade.

The secretary is responsible for a number of departments: Historian, Computer Systems, Ensign Correspondent and your own personalized roster in addition to keeping the minutes of the general meeting and Executive Board meetings. Communication between national, district and the individual squadrons would fail without the secretary. It is the responsibility of the secretary to keep the information in DB 2000 current and this can only be done with membership participation.

Now that the year is winding down, the nominating committee will be hard at work preparing the slate of officers. Are you ready to participate?
