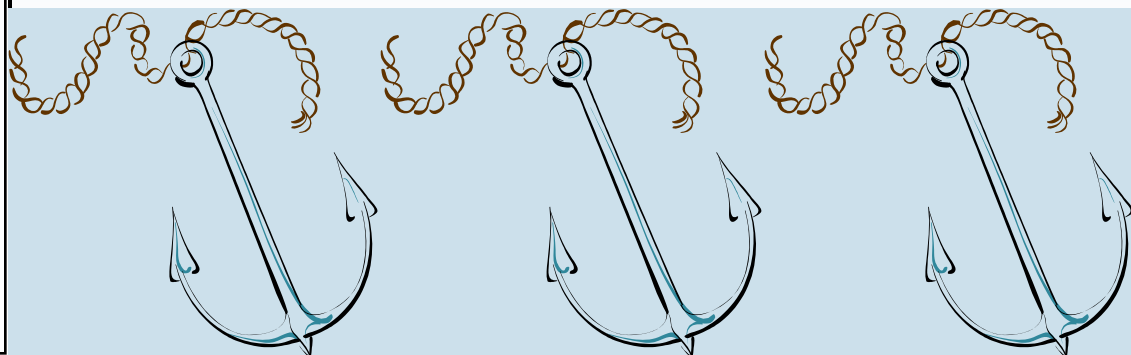

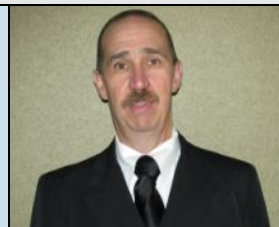
Boating activities:

Who Am I?

Born in the shadow of Ebbets Field (If you're from the right town, you know where that is.), I moved to the fictional neighborhood of Archie Bunker when I was two. Joined the Boy Scouts in the seventh grade and have been in one sort of uniform or another ever since. This was followed by three years in the Florida Panhandle, still warm, where I kept giving those check rides and helped test armament systems - guns and bombs.

I forgot to cover up my name tag when talking to the assignments officer and found myself going to F-111's in England via Las Vegas - exciting job for a navigator used to sitting towards the back of the aircraft. (First time we did an Immelman, I almost had an accident!) But it was (is) a great aircraft, underappreciated in its time, and I got to work in the right seat! But, alas, I flew them for only two years and had to move up(?) and fly a desk for the last two years in the U.K.


From England it was back to the sun at Kennedy Space Center getting the Air Force ready to launch the Shuttle from Vandenberg AFB (it never happened) and sharing Air Force and NASA training capabilities. Oh, I also came upon my fourth USPS squadron in Cocoa Beach and have been enjoying it ever since.

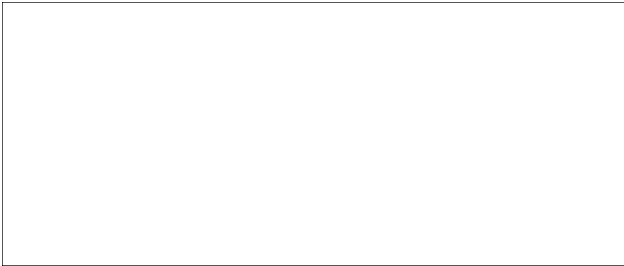

