



A Merit Mark is a squadron's award for those members who volunteer to assist with the numerous activities throughout the year. The award is given to those who serve on the bridge, chair or serve on a committee, teach a class, assist with the public boating course, participate in the co-op charting and VSE programs, or volunteer their time for any of the numerous events that occur throughout the year. Earn one a year for 25 years and you become a Life Member who no longer pays dues.

At the Change of Watch last February I challenged the squadron to increase the number of Merit Marks earned by our members. It was my hope that many new member names would be added to the list of the veteran members earning an award. We will soon know if we were successful.

Merit Marks will be submitted to Lt. Lea Collins, P, by October 15th. The Executive Board will meet prior to that time to review the roster to be sure that no names are over-looked. You could help by reminding your department head of what you have done this year. Please call, or better yet email them a list of your volunteer activities, remembering that anything you do up until December 31 is eligible.

Think you may be short of volunteer hours? What is left to do before year end? Why not get out and do some Co-op Charting? 1/Lt Bob Schaefer, P, will be glad to give you some assistance in this regard. Vessel Safety Examiners are given a Merit Mark if they complete 10 VSE's. One trip to any local boat launch ramp will cover that. There are several social activities on the up-coming calendar all of which could use some volunteers; contact Entertainment Chairperson P/C Susan Kneeland, SN, and offer your services.

And if this was your year to be one of those who participated in the activities without volunteering, we thank you. Attending meetings, taking classes, and joining in the social events are evidence that you are benefiting from membership in CBPS and that is very important to the health of the organization.

Interested in earning a Merit Mark next year? Planning for the next year is already underway. The Nominating Committee is calling members to fill the many volunteer positions available. Saying "yes" when called will put you on the road to doing so.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT P/Lt/C Mike Stone, P

The summer is almost over and September is already upon us. Those of us here in Florida still need to keep an eye on the weather as we are in the peak of the hurricane season for our locale. Keeping that in mind, we need to be prepared to secure our homes and boats in case a hurricane or even a tropical storm should pay a visit. Now is the time to check boat batteries so bilge pumps can operate when needed, check all the lines to see they are not frayed or worn and to have proper chafing protection for those lines. You should secure all loose items onboard to prevent damage during a storm. It is also a good idea to remove electronic devices and canvas so they will be better protected. A few hours of planning could make the difference in how the boat weathers a storm.

The Executive Department has been fairly quiet while many of our members took time off to travel. We welcome them all back and hope they are raring to go to finish out the year.

Two committees that have not been idle over the summer months are Coop Charting and Vessel Safety. Coop Charting Committee members have continued to make reports and are being urged by Lt. Bob Schaefer, P, to continue to do so. Last year CBPS led the district in Coop Charting points and Bob is hoping to repeat that this year.

Lt. Charles Dodds, SN, has been successful in keeping his Vessel Safety Examiners busy and reports that about 176 Vessel Safety Exams have been completed. We should reach 200 inspections by the end of the year. All you examiners out there, let's do our share to reach that goal.

SEO REPORT P/D/C Fred Adame, SN

Our special GPS seminar, taught by Lt Jack Wurst, AP, is now winding up. I was able to attend only the first session of the course, but it was certainly an interesting one. Jack personally obtained the use of five, brand new Garmin GPS 76 Map receivers from West Marine and they really helped with the course. Good job, Jack.

Marine Electronics with Howard Bernbaum, SN, will begin on Monday, 25 September, at Wuesthoff Hospital. It will probably run about 12 weeks of instruction by my reckoning. It is filling up and we now have seven members enrolled. If you want to be assured of a book on opening night, better sign up by giving me a call at 635-8455.

At the NYC Governing Board it was announced that a new Junior Navigation course will be released in October of this year. The course has been shortened to include only sun sights, and to have the celestial sight folder graded in the local squadron. I have volunteered to teach this course in its beta version if we get enough members interested. Give me a call to add your name to the list. Remember, you must already be an AP. And, in case you wondered, you don't need celestial navigation on the Indian River, or even off shore these days. Members take this course to learn about the cosmos, to stretch their mind and to master one of the traditional skills of the master mariner.

Next course on the horizon will be the new Seamanship, to be taught by R/C's Dick and Jane Schnoor, SN, at the Cocoa Library. This course will follow the Boat Smart course. This promises to be a great new course with just one, easy exam. You take it for the enjoyment of learning, not to worry about the test. Once again, call me to sign up.

And now for some special good news: I recently received information that our five Piloting students had all passed their examinations with excellent grades and can now write "Pilot" after their names. 
