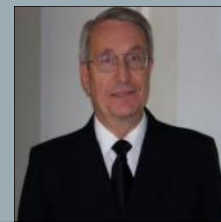

Boating Alone?.....Don't be caught unaware on the water!

You decide to splurge in some alone time on the water....just you and your boat, but what if something goes wrong?

Before shoving off to become one with Mother Nature, tell someone where you are going, what you are doing, and when you will return. It's easy and absolutely necessary for safe boating.

Write down a description of your boat, and the registration number. That way, if you are late getting home, someone knows to send for help. Waiting a few hours for help is a lot safer than spending a whole night on the water alone!

Tips for boating alone:

- Wear a life jacket!**
- Know your location at all times!**
- If you go overboard, stay calm. Don't thrash about, or try to remove clothing or footwear. Keep your knees bent, float on your back, and paddle slowly to safety.**
- Do not drink alcohol!**
- Don't relieve yourself, off the side of the boat!**

A bit of local nautical history

Each year around this time in September various patriotic organizations gather at Jetty Park in Port Canaveral to honor an American hero. Why September, Commodore John Barry left the shore of this world on 13 September 1803. Why Port Canaveral, the last sea action of the Revolutionary War took place east of here in 1783. Commodore Barry in command of USS Alliance was escorting a large quantity of gold bound for the colonies when a force of three British warships engaged his two ship convoy. The prize the British ships were after was the cargo in the Spanish merchant ship which was in fact full of gold bullion. The French government was giving the gold to the colonies. The treasury of the United States desperately needed the gold if the new country was to be viable and able to stand on its own. After a quick hot action the British squadron was driven off and the gold was secure.

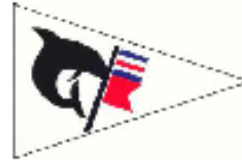

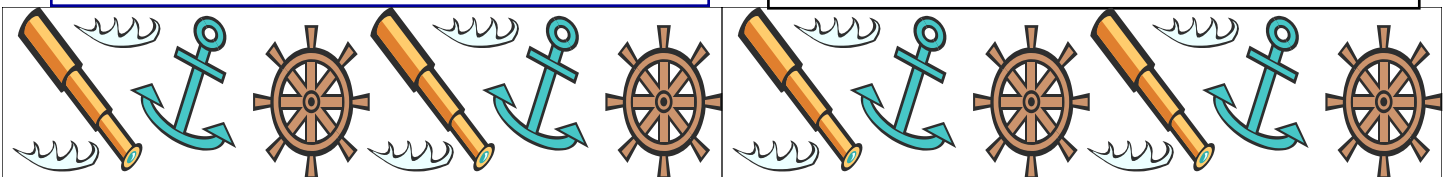
