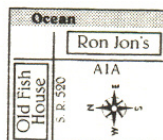

DISTRICT 23 FALL CONFERENCE

As we grind through the dog days of August where each day seems hotter or more humid than the previous, I keep telling myself to stay positive. Looking at the calendar tells me that there is more hot weather behind us than is ahead. Looking ahead also tells me that in a couple of months the Cocoa Beach Power Squadron will have the honor of hosting the District 23 Fall Conference. Our District is quite large and is made up of 11 squadrons from Jacksonville down the coast to Melbourne and down the center of the state to Orlando. Squadrons are represented in practically all major cities in between.

The conference will be held at the beautiful Holiday Inn Cocoa Beach Oceanfront Resort on September 30-October 2. Our committee has been working hard to ensure that this will be one of the best conferences ever. These conferences normally consist of meetings where delegates from all squadrons come to conduct business. Believe me, it will not be all work and no play for those who attend. We have some great social activities planned. One is the Tailgate theme party and Beach Blanket Barbeque, which will be held Friday evening outside on the Tiki Lawn, about 100' from the beach. Attendees are requested to wear attire from their favorite sports team which could be college, professional, NASCAR, etc. The cost for this party is only \$24 and includes the dinner and live entertainment. Another feature is that the Holiday Inn is offering nightly room rates for only \$79.99+ tax. This low price is unheard of for the beach and Judy and I plan to stay there for both nights.

There also are some interesting activities planned for Saturday starting with a Port Canaveral area cruise on Mark and Michelle Anderson's Blue Dolphin for only \$10.60, followed by a free gourmet cooking demonstration by Lt. Bob Mittauer in the mid afternoon, a visit to the Hospitality Suite after the meetings are concluded, and a formal dinner in the evening.

The reason I am writing this article is to make all members of CBPS aware that attendance at the above activities is not just for delegates to the conference, but for you as well, especially the Tailgate Party, Blue Dolphin cruise and cooking demonstration. You don't have to attend the conference meetings. One of our goals is to showcase our squadron to the rest of the District. I can't think of a better way to do this than by a large number of our members join us. Reservations are required so don't delay. Reduce Your Risk of Heart Attack and Cancer

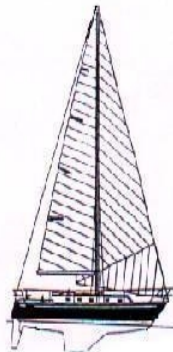

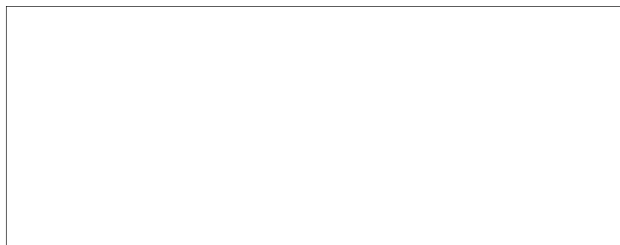
