The waters of Brevard County are a much safer place because of our excellent instructors and our membership who are always interested in the courses offered by The United States Power Squadrons.

This year we conducted:

<u>ABC 3</u> courses, taught by P/C Sandra Schoonmaker, SN and D/Lt/C John Mulkey, AP where we introduce safe boating to new boaters or boaters that wanted to increase their basic boating knowledge. We'll be offering another ABC 3 course in January 2018 so if you know anyone who would like to attend please sign them up.

<u>Cruise & Cruise</u> <u>Planning</u> was taken by one member independently and we're starting up a full class in January 2018 that will to be taught by P/C Gerard Meunier, SN-CN.

<u>Marine Electrical Systems</u> was taught in March by Lt. Richard Schoonmaker, SN where 6 members passed.

<u>Marine Navigation Systems</u> is currently being taught by Lt/C George Shapow, SN where 12 members are taking the course.

<u>Navigation</u> course, the last and highest advanced course that USPS has to offer was continued from 2016 and was taught by P/C Louis Harlow, SN where six were advanced to either N or SN.

The course teaches plotting using GPS but also includes traditional course plotting so the student will be able to safely navigate if the GPS fails. The students will do hands on exercises on plotting techniques. Take home, open book test. This class and Seamanship are prerequisites for the other 3 navigation classes.


Tom and Julie Hoffmann gave us their CBPS burgee to add to the burgee wall at the hotel in Little Current, Ontario, Canada.




