Your 2005-2006 Educational Department got off to a busy start with a department wide meeting on 9 February at the Cocoa Library. We had the chairmen of the Local Boards for Boating, Advanced Grades and Elective Courses all there along with most of our instructors. We did some preliminary planning of the class schedule for the coming year, identified the instructor vacancies and discussed the idea for a summer boating course at Brevard Community College.

Chairman of the Local Board for Boating, Lt. Pete Schmidt, P, conducted a proctors meeting later in February and began the Boat Smart course on Wednesday, 2 March, at Cape Canaveral Hospital. Due to his thorough planning, we had experienced proctors assigned to each table and a cadre of ladies to sell materials, register students, and direct them to their tables. First night registrations were over 36 but we expect more the next week. Exam night is scheduled for the 23rd.

In the Local Board for Advanced Grades (we really do have these boards) under Lt. Bob Flannigan, SN, we just had five members take the Piloting course exam. This was a totally new course, incorporating GPS along with the traditional plotting skills...and there's no interpolating for deviation! The exam is one week, open book. We hope to offer it again in the fall with Lt. Howard Bernbaum, SN, as the instructor. Howard's been through the new course and is sure to make it interesting. Also, under the LB/AG (that's the abbreviation) Lt. Bob Mittauer, AP, has led his class through the first module of the Seamanship course. Their first exam is over and the seven students will have completed the second module by the time you read this. Seamanship teaches the basics of boat handling and is a prerequisite, along with Piloting, for the Advanced Piloting course. Bob knows how to whet his students appetite for more education.

The Local Board for Elective Courses (LB/EC), led by P/D/Lt/C Frank Sebree, SN, will be offering a course in Engine Maintenance beginning on Wednesday, 13 April, at the Cocoa Library. Ably taught by Lt. Gene Millner, AP, the course covers basic operation and maintenance of inboard gasoline and diesel engines along with 2- and 4-cycle outboards. Gene has taught this course before and his former students report a very enlightening and interesting experience. Sign up by calling me at 635-9455.

If we don't receive your renewal by the May issue of the Soundings, your name will be removed from the roster of Sponsors.



RADIO READINESS Jack Wurst, P

I have been asked to be CBPS's Radio Technical Officer, a position not filled in many squadrons. Duties are closely allied with those of the Educational Department. They include facilitating action on radio and electronic matters, disseminating USPS policy on matters relative to the operation of marine electronics, advising of changes in US and international rules of telecommunicating, and promoting safety and good manners in the use of radio channels

The primary avenue I expect to use is monthly (hopefully) articles in The Soundings. This being the first one, it seems appropriate to reinforce USPS's relatively recent acceptance of the *GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM* (GPS) as a subject worthy of being taught in our courses. Both the new **Piloting** and **Advanced Piloting** courses now include the use of GPS as a regular part of navigation.

Many people look at this technology as simply amazing and well beyond their powers of comprehension. However, to trust and use it effectively, a basic understanding is essential. There are several websites that offer easy-to-comprehend help. The first, "www.trimble.com/gps", is an unusually well-prepared description in simple words and clear sketches of the basic theory behind the system. It leads the reader step by step, and even includes a glossary of the terms which are not likely to be familiar to the layman.

The second site is more technical in description, but also more complete. It is "www.colorado.edu/geography/gcraft/notes/gps/gps_f.html". A scientific education probably would be helpful in using this very detailed set of articles.

The final website lists current equipment with comparative reviews and frequently asked questions. It also includes hundreds of links to other sources of information about GPS operation and equipments. It is http://gpsinformation.net.

If this amount of information hasn't satisfied your hunger for learning about electronic navigation, simply Google "GPS" and continue browsing!






