This is the new AP course which emphasizes modern navigation techniques and builds on the recently updated Piloting course. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER'S REPORT Lt/C Joe Derrico, P



Summary of 2007 CBPS Boating Year By Denise Stone

We started the year with our Annual Blessing of the Fleet in April. We tried something different and held it at the Millner's beautiful home on the Indian River. The weather was blustery with 20 knot winds and showers predicted. The Co-Cruise Chairmen decided to have the minister do a "walking blessing of the boats". It worked out very well as Chaplain (& CBPS member) Chuck Lane blessed not only the boats, but also the owners. The boaters that stayed the night had an evening BBQ and a Sunday morning brunch. Seven boats and 35 people attended the event.

Due to many of our active boaters being away for Memorial Day, the cruise to Melbourne Harbor was cancelled.

In July we drove and cruised to lunch at the Sunset Café in Cocoa Beach on the Banana River. Our Commander, Mike Stone, acted as "Dock master" and helped tie the boats safely to the docks. The food and fellowship were wonderful! Six boats and 33 hungry people attended.

In September we had a combined event: the celebration of CBPS's 40th year as a squadron and a cruise to the event at the Eau Gallie Yacht Club. The weather again was exceptional. The food was excellent and the history sharing by Dick Schnoor, charter member, was very interesting. Three boats and 85 people attended. A raft up was held on November 3rd in the upper Banana River. We were there to view the Air Force Thunderbirds in action. They were performing at KSC to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of our American Space Program. The weather of the day was WINDY! The anchor boats were Makin Memories and Conch Key. The captains dropped anchor behind an island hoping to block some of the wind and that plus the size of their boats helped the smaller boats to tie up and not bounce so much in the water. Snacks and stories were shared but only towards the end of the day were we able to see any airplane action. All attendees had a great time! Seven boats and 22 people attended.

The last event of this Commander's year has yet to occur. It's the Captain Hiram's Adventure. So far we have 29 people signed up to drive to Sebastian, FL and have a late lunch at Captain Hiram's and then board the pontoon boat, River Queen, to go out to Pelican Island and see the White Pelicans, Ibis and Roseate Spoonbills come in to roost for the night.

The Co-Cruise Chairs Barbara Millner and Denise Stone want to thank everyone who participated in the Boating Program this year and we hope to see you on the water in 2008!

Vessel Safety Exams- Charlie Dodds, SN

The Vessel Safety Check program for 2008 is underway. All the 14 inspectors have their 2008 decals and supplies and are eager to provide a public service of boat safety inspections. Our primary thrust is the general public but squadron members are always included in the program. We standby to help any of our members with meeting the US Coast Guard standards for 2008 VSC inspection.

We would like as many of the squadron boats as possible the have the 2008 VSC decal. Please contact any of the inspectors for a VSC check. We will make it as easy as possible and will meet you at your boat location. Besides the obvious safety implications, we might be able to save you big bucks on USCG non compliance items.

We have the support of the squadron bridge on the VSC Program. Lt/C Jay Longway was the first squadron member to get the 2008 VSC decal on his boat. Good show! 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
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
