As there is not much official business to report on, I thought you might like a few words about our cruise down to Islamorada aboard Cat House.

After quite a bit of maintenance, including emptying the fuel tanks of very old gas and fiddling with the Suzuki's filters, and the usual provisioning, we left our dock on Dec 23 bound for Dragon Point but anchored north of the bridge at ICW mile 918. Next day, we had to reacquaint ourselves with the up anchor procedure as the Deck wash failed and a bucket was lost overboard. But we had an easy and pleasant few hours to Jones Fruit Dock in Sebastian where the Deck wash was fixed.

We had planned a short 20-mile day for Christmas, but with the pleasant weather and very little boat traffic, we decided to continue to m. 982, then the Hobe Sound anchorage at m. 999, a day ahead of schedule. Again, the next day plan to only go to Lantana was changed as we continued to the anchorage at m. 1042 (oozy and smelly bottom) to take advantage of the favorable weather and reduce the next day run with the increasing boat traffic.

This was a good move, as for my birthday, the wind was on the nose and the uneducated and uncaring boaters out in force. The starboard engine overheated so we anchored for lunch and to check the problem. Probably some junk had clogged the water intake. On departure, the port engine started acting up. The captain was not happy! After anchoring at m. 1080, a good place to be for the expected cold front that night, we changed the in-line fuel filters which both had some dirt. I had fueled the tanks with E-10 gas which had basically cleaned the inside walls with the washing machine motion from the high wake boaters. Don't know if I hate those or ethanol more!

December 28 was a delight with north winds and only one bridge (Venetian Causeway) to open. Our destination, Boca Chita Key was full, so plan B was executed and we anchored in the lee of privately owned and very nicely decorated Pumpkin Island at m. 1122. We then only had an easy and pleasant 33 m. to PYH on beautifully hued waters, two days ahead of schedule.

On the 30th, we decided to go and explore on our bikes, but within ½ mile, I was hit by an SUV... but that is another (and non-boating) story.

Safe Boating is a Choice

Yes, safe boating is a choice and we need to do more to make the public aware of it. Somehow we must impress upon the public that when acquiring a boat, especially for the first time, that they should be properly prepared. Here are some facts taken from the 2010 Boating Accidents Statistical report compiled by the Boating & Waterways Section of the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC):

The State of Florida has the highest number of boating accidents AND boating fatalities in the entire U. S.
 The majority of accidents occurred in small open motor boats.
 66% of the operators in boating accidents had NO boater education.
 73% of these operators were over 22 years old.

Thus they were not mandated by law to take a boating course. The above information should inspire all USPS members to increase their efforts to enroll their boating acquaintances in the Americas Boating Course. After all, the mission of USPS is to save lives. Do you know when your squadron is having its next ABC course?
