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# **Attention on Deck**

At the General Membership meeting on December 4<sup>th</sup>, the members present voted to change the name of Cocoa Beach Power Squadron to be Cocoa Beach Sail and Power Squadron. The vote was conducted in two parts. The first vote was to change the name to include "Sail". The vote was 49 for the change and 11 to stay the same. The second vote was to change the name to be either Cocoa Beach Sail and Power Squadron or Central Brevard Sail and Power Squadron. The vote was 50 to 8 to change the name to Cocoa Beach Sail and Power Squadron. One member left before the second vote and one ballot was invalid. The proposed name change has to be approved by District 23 and USPS National Headquarters before we can proceed with the associated actions necessary to make the change. If approved, the change should take effect early next year.

Don't forget, The January General Membership meeting will be on "<u>FRIDAY</u>", January 4<sup>th</sup>. This is due to a scheduling conflict with the Brevard Veterans Center

### **EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT** Lt/C J. P. Longway III, P



Well, the Education Dept. made it through another year with the help of many members. I want to thank all of you that helped me make 2007 a successful year. First, thanks to all the instructors for doing a great job of teaching. Thanks to all of you that helped with Boat Smart. Thanks to the members that helped recruit students for the classes. Last but not least, thanks to those of you that took the classes. It takes the work of many to have a successful year!

With the start of a new year I thought I should remind you of the courses being offered by USPS. Our courses are divided into two areas; Advanced Grades and Elective Courses. Under Advanced Grades we offer Seamanship, Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Junior Navigation and Navigation. Our Elective Courses include Marine Electronics, Engine Maintenance. Weather, Sail, Cruise Planning, and Instructor Development.

Seamanship is a more thorough coverage of the Squadron Boating Course and is a pre requisite for the other Advanced Grade courses. Piloting is an important course for the local waters enabling the student to understand the need for and how to plan routes. It includes a knowledge of charting; time, speed, distance relationships; bearings; fixes; course plotting; and introduces GPS as a piloting aid. Advanced Piloting includes more of the same, but introduces advanced positioning techniques and the effects of tides and currents. The Navigation course gives the student a thorough knowledge of the theory and practice of celestial navigation. Throughout these courses, the use of GPS navigation is introduced with its attributes and its limitations.

The elective course titles pretty much describe what is in the courses. The student must bear in mind that these courses are not intended to make professional mechanics out of the student, rather, to make us aware of the care and maintenance required and to enable us to take care of some of the problems. The courses are all extremely useful for the kind of boating we do in this area and are of even more importance to those who sail to the islands. Instructor Development is unique. While not a boating specific course, it teaches us the importance of communication and gives us several techniques. For those who are willing to teach public boating classes, the ID course is required for USPS certification.




The St Johns N Club breakfast will be on Sunday morning at 0830. All conference attendees are invited to attend and enjoy the special guest speaker and full breakfast.

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


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






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
