

For those of you that missed the general membership meeting on June 5th, you missed a very informative and entertaining presentation by Bobbi and Mike Huck. They gave a slide presentation on their Great Loop cruise that went from Florida up through Canada, back down through the Tombigbee River and back to Florida. The trip lasted 8 months and covered thousands of miles. The slides were beautiful and Mike's narrative was both funny in places and very informative. We greatly appreciate the time and effort they put into the presentation. Approximately 75 people attended the meeting including some members that we have not seen for quite a while. It was great to see them again.

There has been a change in the CBPS Bridge membership. P/C Sam Greenwood resigned the position as Assistant Squadron Education Officer due to health considerations and P/D/C Fred Adame graciously volunteered to take over that position.

At this time, due to changes within the Executive Committee, there are several open positions that need to be filled. They are Assistant Treasurer, Assistant Administrative Officer (new position), and Member at Large. If you would like to volunteer for any of these positions, please contact me. It is especially important to fill these positions because these are the people that participate in managing the squadron business. Without a full slate of members, it is difficult to effectively manage the squadron business.

At the Change of Watch I expressed my hopes that we would increase boater participation for our scheduled boating events and get the squadron more involved in using our boats. Our first boating event of the year was the Blessing of the Fleet April 21st-22nd. Despite the impending bad weather on Saturday morning, the skies cleared and it turned out to be a great boating weekend after all. Six boats attended the blessing and five boats stayed overnight.

The next boating event was to be the cruise to Melbourne Harbor May 26th-27th. That was a different story. We started off with 6 boats signed up for the cruise but by the final days, only the Millners and the Stones remained. I did not think that this was sufficient to consider it a CBPS boating event so I cancelled the cruise due to lack of participation.

The next boating opportunity is a joint rendezvous with Seminole Squadron at the west entrance to the barge canal on July 4th. Seminole squadron members are planning to launch their boats at the Titusville marina and meet up at Breakfast Island (the island just west of the barge canal entrance from the Indian River). From there they plan to go through the barge canal to check out the cruise ship activity at the port. They have invited us to join with them at Breakfast Island and enjoy the festivities. Since they are going to be in our back yard, it would be a nice gesture to greet them and make them welcome to our neighborhood.

Elsewhere in the Soundings you will find a flyer describing the next CBPS boating event; the Sunset Café cruise on July 14th. Last year we had a great turnout and this year is expected to be a repeat. You can choose from the menu so there is no up front cost. The food is very good and the company absolutely wonderful. Plan to come either by boat or car but do come and join us in the fun.

Radio Technical Officer Report

In last month's report, I emphasized that when out on your boat, you should have your VHF radio and cell phone 'on'. The VHF should be monitoring the calling and distress signal Channel 16. After establishing contact with another station, switch to Channels 67, 68, 69, 71, 72 or 78. Many sailboats use Ch. 17. When requesting bridge openings in Florida, use Ch. 9. Never use Ch. 70 for any normal conversations. This is now the Digital Selective Calling (DSC) channel. This is explained below.

New VHF radios have the DSC capability making distress calls very easy and helpful. When shopping for one of these radios make sure that it has the proper NMEA connections to allow it to interface with your GPS. Your Latitude and Longitude will be displayed on the radio's face.

To make a DSC distress call, press and hold the distress button until the radio's display shows the call has been sent and the radio will sound an audible distress alarm. The radio will automatically monitor Ch. 70 for a DSC acknowledgement and also receive calls on Ch. 16. When a DSC acknowledgement signal is received, an alarm sounds, Ch. 16 is automatically selected, and the display screen shows the Maritime Mobile Service Identity (MMSI) of the responding radio. Your lat/long is transmitted to the receiving radio for your rescue location if needed. You can obtain your free MMSI number from Boat U. S.. This new service will make distress calls less distressful, easier and more useful to the Coast Guard or other rescue services.



The USPS Strategic Plan for D23 would like us to have 1,123 members. At present we are 94.2% of that goal. We need only 65 additional members to reach it. 




