





And now, the rest of the story...

#### EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Did you ever stop to think that the Executive Department houses the committees that provide some very useful services to our community?

The most obvious are the Vessel Safety Exams that members conduct for boaters with whom we share our waterways. while talking with the boaters in the process of completing the inspection, the examiners share their expertise and answer safe boating questions--sometimes a mini "safe boating" lesson at the launch ramp!

To date, CBPS Vessel Safety Examiners have completed over 170 boat inspections. That means that there are now 170 boaters who are operating vessels that are either safely equipped or who are aware of any deficiencies that they may have.

During the month of May we recognized Safe Boating Week. Not only did we "bless" our own boats but we had a group of members who distributed Safe Boating literature to the public elementary schools on Merritt Island and Cocoa Beach.

The squadron also provides a service to NOAA through the Co-Op Charting Program. Lt. Bob Schaefer, P, conducted a training session on this subject and soon a whole new group will join the veteran reporters to assist in up-dating charts and locating markers, hopefully duplicating last year's success of being number 1 in District 23.

Although the squadron cannot as an organization become involved in legislative issues, our membership needs to be informed and then to act independently, as they see fit, on issues pertinent to boating. Thanks to John Lynn and Gene Millner, squadron members are kept up-to-date and several have become instrumental in influencing decisions that affect access and usage of local waterways.

It is gratifying to count up the number of members who are involved in these community services. Too often we focus on what the members are not doing and overlook the fact that there are a lot of folks doing a lot of good things for our community. Thank you to all of your time and efforts that reflect so highly upon the Cocoa Beach Power Squadron!

Still not getting HQ 800's from all Squadrons. Please make an effort to get your schedules of Public Boating classes posted on the USPS web page. This info will then be transmitted to Boat/US and various Florida State agencies who will publish and direct some potential Boating candidates to your phone or email contact. Also, I presume all SEO's know to send electronically or mail the ED-27's to HQ **immediately** after the final exam. If you send your ED-27 report to HQ via internet, HQ will automatically forward a copy to me. Otherwise, address the other copy to me, stamp and mail. See, the easy way is via internet.

Please start thinking about your Squadron candidate for the 2005 Chapman Award. Mid March all Squadrons received a packet with forms and instructions for recommending your most outstanding instructor. The Charles F. Chapman Award for Excellence in Teaching is presented annually to 5 individuals selected from District nominations who have shown outstanding performance in instruction of USPS courses.

Last year only 3 Squadrons from D/23 submitted a candidate. This year let's have 11 Chapman candidates. As the rules say, you can submit the same candidate again, write the nomination up a little different, another slant, etc. This is salesmanship!!!

With 11 resumés to judge, the field is much deeper and the District selection for the National competition is a greater honor for the individual and the Squadron.

SEO's please review the packet of information with your Commander and send your recommendation and write-up to me not later than 1 August 2005.

# How to Ease Info Geodetic Marker Recovery For Co-op Charting Credits (first of How-To articles)

There are three parts to getting credits for geodetic marker recovery in the co-op charting progam.

- 1. Homework to locate the markers you want to locate. This is computer work thru <a href="https://www.geocaching.com/mark">www.geocaching.com/mark</a> (CTRL+click to enter site now and be sure to save to favorites all web page references so you don't have to enter address again-once is enough) where you locate markers thru a zip code. The web page lists the markers by PID #. Left click on the PID and read more about a marker. In the right column you may see that a member of the geo-caching club has found the mark and may have taken pictures. Easiest to locate at first a marker that member shows. They don't seem to report their findings to NGS.
- 2.Go out and find the mark. Take a pic of it with a GPS next to it showing the Lat and Lon so you can compare the Lat and Lon shown for the PID #.
- 3. Report the finding to NGS at <a href="http://www.ngs.noaa.gov/FORMS-PROCESSING-cgi-bin/recvy-entry-www.pri">http://www.ngs.noaa.gov/FORMS-PROCESSING-cgi-bin/recvy-entry-www.pri</a> Fill out the form. If you have mort that one PID to report, fill out the form, then back up and fill it out for the second PID, etc. A marker may only be reported once every 12 mos. The form will ask at the end is this mark is available for satellite viewing. Ans yes or no.

Next report the finding to/FORMS- the co-op charting page. This is where you send the report to the District Chmn for award of credits. Speaking of credits when report time spent report all your research time and time of finding the mark and reporting or them to NGS and Co-op charting.

If you have not logged into the co-op charting program go to <a href="http://www.usps.org/national/coch/site/top.html">http://www.usps.org/national/coch/site/top.html</a> (CTRL+click to enter site) Click on CCWEB in left column and in the next page again click on CCWEB-at upper right. This will bring up a practice page enter page. To enter it use the username A000000 (that's 6 zero's). In the second space enter yourself as a general user and then use the word "test" for the password. This will bring up the actual practice page. There is a change of profile line. Go to it and fill out the questions. Use 'cocoab' for your password. Log out to the home page and then reenter with your USPG #, general user and password 'cocoab" Go to making a report and fill out the first form of those participating in the recovery. Go to geodetic reports. Change the date at the top first. Then fill out the requested data. Put in date reported to NGS and ultimately fill in the time and mileage info. At the bottom send report to Dist Chmn. The form will ask is you really want to send the report now and ans. Yes.

When you sign into the co-op charting page-practice or home—you will see on the left a column of add'l info pages. Best to take the time to read what is there. The guide at the top has many add'l pages. You don't have to read it all but best to review.

You may wish to read the credits document so you get the best bang for you efforts and time!!!!!!!!!


