We are just a small part of the large educational team that will be running our education program for 2005. On the team are many conscientious instructors who make up our three local boards: the Local Board for Boating stages the boating classes, the Local Board for Advanced Courses runs the Advanced Grades (S, P, AP. JN. N) and the Local Board for Elective Courses conducts the Elective Courses for our members. In addition we have a Teaching Aids Committee and Educational Department Registrar. It's a big team with a big job.

That big job is to carry out one of the prime functions of USPS – education. Remember the mission of USPS? *To promote recreational boating safety through education and civic activities while providing fellowship for our members.* While fellowship is important, it is promoting boating safety that has made the Power Squadrons the nationally recognized organization that it is (and given us our 501 C(3) tax status.)
