There will be films of the 1948, three month adventure to the arctic under the command of Admiral Donald B. Mac Millan, the last living member of the 1909 Perry North Pole Discovery Expedition. Filmed and narrated by Paul Eitel, (then age 16) includes shots of a Labrador whaling station, walrus, polar bears and Eskimos on board the 88' exploration schooner "Bowdoin"." The "Bowdoin" is the flagship of Maine Maritime Academy in Brunswick. Paul and his wife Billie lived 21 years on their Hatteras 58' Long Range Cruiser. Last year they moved from Santa Barbara to Indian River Colony Club. With their good friends Mary and Keith Klock, the Eitels just brought their new 30' Grady White from Ft. Here again there were some newer members assisting. At this time 5 new members have joined from the class, each of whom we encourage to become actively involved.

The other big event in which members participated was the CFW Flea Market at Harbortown Marina. Working two hour shifts over the two-day period was a mix of new and veteran members. P/C Larry Hatfield, SN and Lt. George Guerrero were responsible for setting up the display and arranging the volunteers. Lt. On April 8th and 9th, Citizens for Florida Waterways held a flea market at Harbortown Marina. The Boat Show Committee set up a booth to recruit students for the safe boating course. This is one of the primary ways that CBPS gets students for the safe boating course. Thanks to the efforts of Larry Hatfield and other volunteers several new students signed up for the boating course during the course of the weekend.

Also, during the flea market, several vessel safety examiners were inspecting boats for many boat owners keeping boats at the marina. Six boat owners signed up to schedule inspections in addition to the inspections done this weekend. It was a very productive weekend for the vessel examiners.

If CBPS is to continue to maintain a leadership position in the vessel safety inspection program, member support is essential. There are approximately 100 boats owned by CBPS members. The squadron members should show their support for the inspection program by having their boats inspected. This not only supports the inspection program but also provides important safety for members and their families while enjoying boating activities.

The upcoming Blessing of the Fleet scheduled for May 27^{th} should afford opportunities for more boat inspections.

We still need additional vessel safety inspectors and when we get sufficient candidates, a training class will be held in the near future.

Looking ahead to our next boating course, it will be a one-day course at Cape Canaveral Hospital on 20 May, our first attempt to teach it all in a day. Boating Chairman Report

"Blessing of the Fleet" Saturday, May 27, 2006 is the biggest boating event of the year for the Squadron. As we all take pride in our boats, we also like to show that pride by attending the Blessing each year. Please consider attending this event. Although not mandatory, you need a VHF radio on Channel 69 to know what is going on. Be in your boat on the water, at near center channel, Indian River, just South of the Hwy 520 Bridge at 10:30 AM. You will see a circle of boats forming up. Just fall in with the last boat and follow, making the circle ever larger as more boats join in. Have your friends and neighbors come by boat as well. Listen to the VHF, but please don't have a long conversation on it.

Promptly, at 11:00 AM the leader of the event will leave the circle, heading West and lead all past the Blessing Boat. As you approach, by VHF Channel 69 or shouts, give the boat name, the Captains name and crew names to the religious person. A Blessing will follow from him insuring good and safe boating for the year by Father Tom Gibson, Pastor @ St Mark's Episcopal Church.. Continue following that lead boat, back out to the center of the Indian River Channel as other boats are behind you. When all have been blessed, some will depart and others, our squadron members and guests are invited to attend a picnic at the Lee Wenner Park under the Pavilion at the East end of the Park. Bring what you want to eat and drink. A Fire will be provided for cooking as desired. If you are a trailer boater, you can launch your boat right there at Lee Wenner Park.

As members, if you have them, display the Squadron Burgee and the United States Power Squadron Flag. Lets make this a grand event. Don't forget, if you are available, the 4th Saturday of every month at Water Ski Island or as agreed, is a time to get together and visit and talk boats.

The Eagle Harbour Cruise on April 29^{th} -30^{th} will be nearly a past event as you read this. Looking forward to seeing you. Enjoy great boating.

HAVE YOU EVER BEEN TURNED DOWN--BECAUSE OF LOW Hemoglobin?

Donors may be temporarily deferred if the iron level in their blood is not satisfactory. Women usually have lower iron levels than men. However, iron levels can change on a daily basis, depending on a variety of factors, including diet and exercise. Just because your iron level is low today and you were not able to donate, it is very possible you will be able to donate in a few days. Foods which help to correct low iron levels are;

Best sources are iron fortified cereal and liver.

Good sources are lean meats, greens (turnips, mustard, collards, and spinach), liverwurst, oysters, clams, prunes, raisins, dried apricots, dried peaches, dried beans and green lima beans.

Fair sources are eggs, enriched cereals, enriched bread, blackberries, strawberries, watermelon, black-eyed peas and green peas.

Vitamin C is also needed to help your body use the iron you eat. Oranges, grapefruits, tomatoes (and their juices), greens, broccoli, watermelon, raw cabbage, cantaloupe and strawberries are also good sources.
