In the first quarter of 2013, the Education Department completed two Advanced Grades classes, one ABC class, and one seminar. At the time of this publication we will have underway one Elective Class, one Advanced Grades class, one more ABC class and one more seminar. The people hours which are expended for this type of effort is truly impressive.

We have always recognized the instructors and proctors who make these classes possible. It is obvious that without their dedication there would be no education department.

What we often overlook is the dedication of the students. In today's busy world, it is not always easy to spend two hours a week in class and uncountable hours doing homework. For some this becomes an impossible situation and they are forced to drop out or to not achieve the maximum benefit of the material. For others, it is a challenge but they manage to hang in there and succeed. For each group, there is a commendation for making the effort

I have spoken with members who aren't able to take classes due to the lack of time. It seems this is an issue that we should be able to solve. Any person in this situation should speak with the instructor or with me about this. While missing classes may a problem in some courses, there is no requirement for 100% attendance. If you need some 1:1 tutoring because of missed classes, an instructor can be found. If the normal classroom setting isn't workable, home study is an option for most of our courses. If you just need a little extra time to finish your class work, tests can be ordered singly as well as in a group. With a little creativity, the lack of time can be over come.

Another issue not so easily solved is the relevancy of the subject matter being covered in the Advanced Grades courses. In truth, there are some courses that one takes just for a personal quest for knowledge and the sense of achievement. But for most of our classes the information may seem irrelevant while sitting in a classroom but on the water when the unexpected happens, it may be life saving knowledge. It is hard to predict what will be relevant in our future experiences.

As SEO, I believe that USPS has a roster of excellent courses and I am dedicated to doing all that I can to meet the needs of our members who wish to participate. Please let us help to make it work for you!



Action: All boaters are WELCOME TO BE BLESSED...



As you pass the Blessing Boat, Say your Boats Name, The Captain & Crew names on VHF Channel 72 or shout across, do not stop or change speed. Keep spaced 30 feet Apart in the line and as you pass.

Pastor Jay (John) Bergstresser will "Bless" the Boat & Captain by name as they proceed past. For another year, the plan is that the blessed boat and crew will be safe and have no problems.


