As we enter the new season, I'd like to offer thanks to those lovely bunch of Coco-Nauts for providing a special event, by hosting the Lunch & Learn session at their monthly meeting. It provided an in depth travelogue of the Orient through the insight of first hand travelers. In addition, the next major event of the season, provided a significant number of attendees that participated in the Squadron's 40th Anniversary Luncheon & Party. The fun filled gathering of members/guests celebrated this very important event by honoring the fellowship, education and public services that have been provided over these many years. The only thing that would have made it more successful, is if all, or almost all members would have been able/available to join in the festivities.

At the next Executive Board meeting on 25 September, I will facilitate a discussion on how the Squadron can participate in the "Keep Brevard Beautiful" Coastal Cleanup initiative. ### SEO REPORT P/C John Mulkey, P



The National USPS has the new Boat Operator Certification (BOC) program up and running. With BOC we will be certifying our members as recreational boat operators at one of four levels ranging from certifications to operators on rivers and small lakes, up to ocean crossings. National is now starting the first level, Inland Navigator. We need members to volunteer to be trained as Certifiers. If you are interested in becoming a Certifier please let me know so that I can submit your nomination to the Regional Certifier. Learn more about this program on line at the USPS Educational Department and click on BOC.

Engine Maintenance will begin on October 22, 2007, taught by Lt. Gene Millner, AP at Wuesthoff Hospital in Rockledge. There has been a complete rewrite of this course. It stresses diagnosis of modern systems. Gasoline inboards, outboards and diesel engines are taught in a way that reinforces common aspects of how engines work. The new course also covers basic mechanical systems such as drive systems, steering systems and engine controls.

Seamanship Class will begin on November 14, 2007, taught by Lt. Adrianne Goldstein, P and Lt. Bob Goldstein, AP at the Cocoa Public Library. This is also a completely revised course. Seamanship now covers boat handling in both close quarters maneuvering and underway. How are your docking skills? Do you know the best way to trim your boat? Even if you have taken Seamanship before, you should find this new course interesting.



Beside keeping accurate minutes of all squadron meetings and meetings of the Executive committee, did you know the Squadron Secretary has one of the most important duties in your squadron? Keeping National and then District abreast of current membership information improves communication for every Chair and committee member. But, the Secretaries can only do their job with your assistance. Report all change of address, telephone number changes as well as your e-mail addresses, which seem to change with the currents, to your Squadron Secretary. The Secretary then updates National's DB2000. All roster (information technology) information will then be current on the National, District, and Squadron levels. Ask any Chair or committee member how important that information is for them when trying to get in contact with members of their squadron.

The Squadron Historian section is another facet of the Secretarial Office. It is suggested that a member assume this position for more than one year so that the Historian becomes a link between the changes of watch. Although the completed form needs to be filed within thirty (30) days of the change of watch, the report can be done on an on-going basis. Basic information, such as the elected officers, committee members, etc. is already known. Keep an on-going list of social activities i.e. meetings, cruises, dinners, as well as participation in national, district and community affairs and the better part of the report is done. Members of the Executive Committee and other committee members help ease the Historian's duties by reporting the activity of your department. Finally, two copies are needed to be sent to the District Historian within that thirty day period and an additional copy remains in your squadron files.

Have you visited the District 23 website – <u>www.usps.org/localusps/d23</u> ? Personally, I would like to thank D/Lt Rex Mollentze, S from Seminole for doing such a great job revamping the website. Please let us know if you have any additional information you would like to see included. Include the website in your news publications so new members can become familiar with district functions too.






