1130: USCG overview by a member of Station Port Canaveral.


Tu Oct 6th: The Great Loop – Part 1 with yours truly.

DSC Radio Check from TowboatsUs Submitted by Gene Millner

Boaters along the Gulf and Atlantic coasts from Alabama to New Jersey can take advantage of a new service offered by TowboatUS towing captains to ensure your new Digital Selective Calling (DSC) VHF marine radio is correctly installed, functional, and working properly.

While nearly all fixed mount VHF radios sold today are DSC equipped, this new service has come in response to boaters pointing out that it can be hard to complete a digital radio check unless they have the MMSI of another boater.

The TowboatUS MMSI (Mobile Maritime Service Identity) number is available to boaters hailing from the Gulf Coast at Mobile, AL, Florida and the Atlantic coast up to Sandy Hook, NJ. When this number is "dialed" on a DSC-VHF radio keypad, a boater will automatically be connected to the closest Towboat US port or response boat within radio range.



COOPERATIVE CHARTING IN A NUTSHELL Part Three of Three Lt/C Ernst Hofmann, JN

In the April and May issues we discussed the Cooperative Charting opportunities offered to members and we also explained four of the six programs. Here are the last four.

U.S. Coast Pilot

The NOS Coast Pilot is a series of nine books, published by the U.S. Department of Commerce, that contain a wide variety of information important to navigators and recreational boatmen. These books supplement the information that cannot be shown graphically on the standard nautical chart and is not readily available elsewhere. The subjects in the Coast Pilot include, but are not limited to, channel descriptions, anchorages, bridge and cable clearances, currents, tides and water levels, prominent features, pilotage, towage, weather, ice conditions, wharf descriptions, dangers, routes, traffic separation schemes, small craft facilities and Federal regulations applicable to navigation. Using the Internet, you can download a single page or a complete Coast Pilot Book. The URL is http://nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/nsd/cpdownload.htm. All volumes are available at this website.

The Range Line Survey is a relatively new initiative within the NOS-USPS Cooperative Charting Program. Under this proposal, USPS members will collect positioning information on navigational ranges that appear on NOAA charts. This data will be logged by the observer, entered into a computer file, and then uploaded using the CCWeb.

Small Craft Facilities (SCF) are marinas, boatyards, and other marine facilities that service small nautical craft. There are four requirements for a marine facility to be included by NOAA as a Small Craft Facility. The requirements are that such facilities must:

- 1. Be open to the public and not be a private facility.
- 2. Have gas and/or diesel fuel for sale.
- 3. Have a pump-out facility (or has access to a municipality or community facility).
- 4. Have transient berths and/or moorings.

SCFs are listed on the charts, usually on top along the tide tables, showing the services that they offer. It is our function to visit the SCFs periodically and update the services, which they offer.

Depth Surveys is the program that requires the most time and attention to detail. It consists of laying out the course and taking soundings at about ten second intervals. With the use of DepthWiz and other software the corrected soundings are overlaid on a nautical chart and are then used to verify or supplement charted depth information.

So far BRSPS has conducted three surveys which were accepted by NOAA. (Eau Gallie River approach, Dragon Point and Banana River south of the Pineda Causeway).

Keep in mind that surveys do not have to be conducted in the squadron's vicinity – you can go anywhere a US nautical chart shows data. It is important to contact me before going out on a survey to ascertain that proper procedures will be followed.

As with all organizations, communication is of the upmost importance for a successful organization. We, as members of the United States Power Squadrons® have an extremely powerful tool in DB 2000 to aid in the communication process with members on the National and District level and with other local members of USPS®.

DB2000 is an USPS® National database that contains pertinent information on each member of USPS®. Information available includes: name, certificate number, address, spouse's name, phone numbers (home and cell, if provided) and e-mail addresses. Current rank on the National level as well on the squadron level is also included. National does update the grade as the educational classes are completed and passed. The current number of a member's earned merit marks can also be found in DB2000. Interested in the type of boat and boat name of a member? That could also be found in DB2000.

National HQ does update information coming to HQ but, personal information comes from YOU, the member, FIRST. Your individual squadron secretary is responsible for updating the information provided to them from YOU.

In this age of electronics, many members change phone numbers and e-mail addresses frequently. You can imagine how this would affect communication among squadrons. This information MUST be communicated to your secretary and entered into DB2000 (the squadron access code is obtained from your Squadron Commander). What good is outdated information when your newest Roster is printed? Your Squadron Roster can easily be downloaded and customized to provide the information your squadron wants to present to your members.

The Roster compiled by the District Secretary is also obtained from the DB2000 database. It is the responsibility of the Squadron secretary to provide the names of the officers and the committee chairs in your squadron to the District Secretary. There is no need to wait for the deadline for the District Roster since many of the Executive Committees now actually change in the fall. Please forward the names and positions to the District Secretary as the Change of Watch occur. Updates can then be addressed prior to the actual printing.

Squadron Historians – Please note the Historian Reports for the 2009-2010 year need to be sent to the District Historian or to the District Secretary within thirty (30) days of your Change of Watch.




