Our Radio Technical Officer Lt Eugene B. Millner, AP, announced at our General meeting that Boat/ US is fighting an FCC proposal to allow private high-speed internet and cell phone service frequencies close to existing GPS frequencies as these could interfere with CPS communications. Boat/US went to Washington's FCC offices in July. Gene will keep us informed.

We now have 74 Vessel safety Inspections. The goal, of course, is to beat our excellent 2010 number of 145. Will we make it? Members with boats not yet inspected, please help by calling one of our Vessel Examiners (see page 15 of our Roster). Each of them need 10 inspections to earn a Merit Mark; you can help them achieve that. I, personnally, have to do more, so don't hesitate. Even if your vessel is not ship-shape, the Squadron still get a VSI credit and the inspection results are confidential.

This has been a busy time for the Education Department. We have had three ABC3 Public Boating Courses so far this year with, the next one coming up on October 1st & 8th. We have had 38 students take the course, 34 passed and 14 of them have accepted a free six month trial membership. We had more new members at the August meeting than I have ever seen. It is important that we make sure they are invited to all of our activities and made to feel welcome.

On Friday July 29, I was invited to speak on safe boating to Troup FL0031 of the American Heritage Girls. This is a Christian Organization very similar to the Girl Scouts.We had 15 Troup members, their siblings and parents. I was told that my talk would help them get their Safe Boating Merit Badge. I should have told them to look before they jumped out of the boat as one girl jumped on a stingray and was stung. She was taken to the emergency room and she is doing fine.

Seven of the new members have expressed interest in taking Seamanship. This course will start on Sept. 12. See the flyer. Call me if you would like to take Seamanship.

National USPS has set up a program on Boat Operators Certification and On The Water Training. There will be BOC Certifier Training Seminar held at the Fall Conference on Friday September 30 in Deland.

Radio Check – Radio Check LT Eugene B. Millner, AP



Radio checks on VHF are no longer needed or proper on Chanel 16. A new service provided by Sea Tow can be done 24/7 on Ch. 26 in northern Brevard and 27 in southern Brevard.

To use this automated service, turn to the applicable channel and ask for the radio check. You signal is sent back to you just as you sent so you can hear it.

This service will reduce traffic on Channel 16 and encourage safe boating in the Brevard area.

The antenna for northern Brevard is located at Port Canaveral Marine in Port Canaveral and for southern Brevard it is located at Captain Butchers in Sebastian.

This free service is available through Sea Tow's ongoing partnership with MariTEL. This information was obtained from the July Issue of the *Citizens for Florida's Waterways* (CFFW). This organization does a lot for boating interests. A Group No. is available through the Power Squadron for membership at ¹/₂ price.

At a recent public Safe Boating Class, each of the Squadron Bridge members were asked to say a few words about why they joined and remained as a member of the Power Squadron. You've heard the analogy before, but I likened the attraction of USPS to the three legs of a stool in which all legs play a strong role lest the stool topple over. The three legs are Civic Involvement (Vessel Inspections, Co-op Charting, Community Clean-ups, Public Boating Classes and Seminars etc.), Education (Advanced Classes, Seminars, Guest Speakers at General Meetings, Certification Programs etc.) and Social (Rendezvous on the water, Fishing Tournaments, Cookouts on land and sea, Monthly Dining Outs etc.). All three legs play an important part in attracting new members and retaining current ones. Not all people are attracted to all three legs and some are attracted much more to one than another. The key to success is that we must recognize the broad and diverse reasons that attract people to our group and ensure that all three legs remain sturdy and level through constant maintenance and attention.

That being said, my main mission this month is to thank all of you who have already renewed your membership in a timely manner! Your actions will help keep the stool on a solid footing and will give us the resources necessary to fund our Educational, Civic and Social endeavors. You don't have to be the Treasurer to realize that your tax-deductible dues are our primary source of revenue and without it we would cease to exist. Let me spend a minute and discuss membership renewals in general. All of us who have been on the Bridge know the drill - look at the listing of those members who are late in renewing and assign someone to give them a call. This is great. USPS surveys have shown that the number one reason that people leave the organization is not that they are unhappy with the group or angry about something but because they forgot! So keep up the traditional method of friendly reminders - we are bombarded with mail and other forms of communication and a call will correct a large percentage of late renewals. But the larger and more daunting challenge is how to get through to that part of the population who is no longer engaged in our organization. We must all step up our efforts to build personal relationships with all of our members. We need to get them to our meetings by having interesting programs and speakers. We need to send out letters to encourage them to take that next class. We need to ask them to be on that committee, to host that function, to teach that seminar, to supply that snack.

The survey, I previously mentioned showed that if someone is a member of an active squadron or is on a committee or has attended the annual meeting or district conference will in all likelihood renew their membership without even being reminded. These people shouldn't just be "renewals", they should be our friends. We shouldn't be calling them once a year; we should be calling about joining us at the next class, meeting, party. To me, the United States Power Squadron is not a national organization - it's a group of my closest friends who all decided to wear the same outfit. Let's treat member retention that way - holding onto our friends.


WHO IS THE LONGEST CONTINUOUS ADVER-TISER in Soundings??? By Duane Balkema


