

# **Boating Education**

Here's a brief update on the courses completed by our Squadron in 2017. A total of six courses were offered: Seamanship; Piloting; Navigation; Marine Electrical Systems; Weather; and Cruise planning. Thirty-nine members enrolled in these classes and to date, thirty-six have passed and three did not test. That's a 100% pass rate. Kudos to our dedicated staff of instructors and students for doing so well. In addition to these courses, the ABC course was held on four separate occasions. A total of thirty-six members of the public were educated in basic boating knowledge and earned their Florida Safe Boater's ID card.

We started off the current year with Cruise Planning. Thirteen students are in this class and will take their test on March 5<sup>th</sup>. The Piloting course is also underway with five students registered. The Sail course starts on March 5<sup>th</sup> with four students enrolled. In April we will offer Advanced Piloting, followed by Engine Maintenance in May. In September we will offer Seamanship, Junior Navigation and Marine Communication Systems. Plenty of good courses to choose from! We will also be presenting the ABC course on Saturday, May 5<sup>th</sup> at Port Canaveral Yacht Club. Please let your neighbors and friends know about this course. We will hold another ABC course on September 8<sup>th</sup> at Port Canaveral Yacht Club.

If you do not have the time to take one of our traditional eight or nine-week classroom courses, I strongly urge you to visit the Educational Department's home page on the USPS.org website. Once you sign in with your member ID#, go to the Educational Department page. As you scroll over the topics on the left, you'll find a lot of interesting information. On-Line Courses under "Find a Course" is where you will find out all the various online seminars and webinars that USPS offers. Under "Digital Media Library", you will find out all sorts of free videos such as anchoring, life jackets, man overboard, visual distress signals, mooring, and many more topics. And under "Apps for Boaters", you will find many useful boating related apps for your phone or tablet. There is a wealth of boating educational material available to you on that home page. I urge you to check it out!

Please take advantage of all the educational opportunities, classroom or online, that your Squadron and USPS has to offer. It is one of the main benefits of being a member of United States Power Squadrons, America's Boating Club!


